Fall is here at Crestwood Elementary and that means it is time to get the word out about our primary PTA fundraiser, Blaze the Trail. Blaze the Trail is a walk-a-thon that serves as a unique and effective way to fund projects and PTA programs at our school. Unlike traditional catalog sales of the past, 100\% of the money donated to the event is spent at Crestwood Elementary.


The PTA collects sponsorships for $\$ 200$ from community businesses interested in supporting our school. These businesses have their company logo printed on our event $t$-shirts. This year every student and staff member will receive a Blaze the Trail shirt. The sponsorships are used to fund the cost of the event so that donations collected by the students go towards our $\$ 12,000$ goal. We will also be promoting the community sponsors using our growing Facebook presence, website and future newsletters.

Last week's Tuesday folder included the pledge form and letter outlining incentives for participation. We have a very manageable goal of $\$ 12,000$, but need the participation of our entire student body to get there. Whether it is a $\$ 5$ pledge from a neighbor, a $\$ 10$ pledge from a Grandparent or money Mom and Dad contribute, every pledge counts towards moving us toward our goal. The event will be held on October 18th , which is the deadline for turning in pledge money; however, pledges may be turned in at any time.

Pledges turned in by the early-bird date of October $5^{\text {th }}$ are eligible to be entered in a prize drawing. Students receive an entry for every $\$ 30$ raised. One winner will be drawn from grades $\mathrm{K}-2 \mathrm{nd}$ to win a personal DVD player. One winner will be drawn from grades $3^{\text {rd }}-5^{\text {th }}$ to win an Ipod Nano. Every classroom with $75 \%$ participation wins a trail mix party. The classroom downstairs and the classroom upstairs with the most money raised will win a Playground Pack filled with 28 items for recess.

This year the PTA has pledged to contribute $\$ 8,000$ to build the gazebo-style outdoor classroom for our campus that was designed to memorialize Mrs. Stevens, a former beloved teacher. Our hope is to break ground on this project in the spring, but we need your support to do it. Please participate in contributing to Blaze the Trail. Also, please know that you are welcome and encouraged to take part in the walk-a-thon itself. It is a really fun day for our kids. Captain Cougar and a lively DJ are on hand to encourage the students as they walk during their related arts period. ## Teachers Need Your Help

One of the best ways to help your child's class is to become a Room Parent or offer to help one out. A Room Parent is in charge of coordinating class parities throughout the year and typically organizes an end-of-the-year teacher's gift. ## Nut-free Snack Policy
